OVERVIEW

Application

Through a competitive application process, 2-4 students per school will be selected to participate in The Purple Fellowship.

For those that are unable to participate in the Fellowship, there are still ways to be involved in Go Purple Day! You can join your school's planning committee or Purple Club.

Training

Students participate in a 9 week training that take place on Wednesday evening with students from across the country. In the next section, you can find a detailed curriculum overview.

Train session will be 75 minutes long. The timing of the training will be finalized once students are accepted, but is not expected to begin before 7:45 PM EST/4:45 PM PST

Go Purple Day

After the training, fellows will take the lead in the planning process for their school's Go Purple Day in February, which is Teen Dating Violence Awareness Month

"After participating in the Purple Fellowship and running my school's Go Purple Day, I saw first hand the impact and outreach possible that can be achieved through education and I want to continue that work.
